

Jack Slentz Sand Disk. 2006 Wood 14 x 3 x 14.25" \$2.800 + s/h

"Known as the 'slash and burn' artist of the 1998 residency, Jack Slentz of New Mexico seized his time by the horns. If another turner made a mistake with a piece, it might end up at Slentz's bench where it would be transformed through the application of torch or chainsaw. The immediate and sometimes violent carved surfaces of his sculptures reflect this energy, as does the green wood that he often selected as a material to exploit natural warping and splitting."
